Jesus of Nazareth and Spirituality

It is necessary to substantiate the meaning "of Nazareth," since the pure name Jesus comes from Latin's *lesus*, which was translated from the Greek *lēsous*, which in turn was transliterated from Aramaic, a language prior to Hebrew.

Thus, the emphasis "of Nazareth" highlights a Jewish boy from Galilee, reported in the gospels of Mathew and John who witnessed what they heard directly from the mouth of YESHUA, for some, or YAUSHA, for others. Since primitive Hebrew still did not accentuate letters, there was a loss in the original pronunciation of what He heard his mother call him.

Furthermore, the title "of Nazareth" emphasizes the Master who performed many healings and wonders, just like his apostles did in the early church. People started to believe in a supernatural power due to these miracles. This power came from Him and is eternal. This justifies how someone can sleep among famished, snoring lions and the next morning enter an arena singing.

The apostles performed many supernatural miracles for the benefit of the first Christian generations. These early Christians were blindly convinced to serve Him even to the point of death. These miracles gave strength to the birth of Christianity in Palestine and truth to present-day Christianity. Only a deep-rooted conviction like that would be able to overcome the fear of persecution to give rise to the Messianic religion.

At this point, Jesus of Nazareth is recognized as the actual Messiah because above all, he gave power to the apostles to work miracles in His absence, which testifies to the origin of His power in God Almighty. However, churches used the gospels of Mathew and John to expand their borders, forgetting about miracles as a true sign of intimacy with YHWH and this new way of life given by Jesus. The reason for this is that it was crucial to maintain the unity of the European continent and Christianity in the face of the Muslim invasion in the 8th century. Finally, the names; "of Nazareth", "Nazarean", "Christ", among many others after the name of Jesus, identifies YESHUA, or YAUSHA, of the tribe of Judah that exalts the God of Israel, the Father, as He has taught us to pray.

Having clarified the emphasis on the name of Jesus of Nazareth, let us turn our attention to a spirituality that is in tune with science and truth, without religious beliefs. Where we perceive life as a road that ends at a wall and beyond this wall, no one knows where the road goes. However, religions have considered diverse and uncontemplatable hypotheses of where this road goes to explain a unique future reality.

The future is death, full of mysteries due to the dichotomy presented between religions; however, there is a common idea in all doctrines from which the truth unanimously emerges. Within this zone of intersection, for those who believe in the afterlife, the transition can be understood as fifth graders confiding in sixth graders to find out what to expect after summer vacation. Obviously, these future sixth graders will find this information very helpful, whereas those fifth graders who did not confide in the sixth graders will feel uncomfortable and apprehensive about the sixth grade.

The transition can also be likened to the modern world of information technology. In the last century, the instant transmission of a book from one country to another was inconceivable. Moreover, the word "evolution" is repeatedly used to describe how we got here. Continuity is also evolution, in which an individual is like an embodied file, like a pen drive. Each person's spirit is the *software* that cohabits with the *hardware* of the body and this hardware wears out and dies, just like all life in nature.

As the body wears down, the interesting *software* is saved or copied, in a form incomprehensible to man at the beginning of the 21st century. In such a selection, the idea of death is unpleasant for those who know that they will not be well received in the next life, whereas those who are reconnected to the living God capture the Creator's interest in reusing them in another, immortal existence since they have some use for the Great Programmer.

Apprehension of the unknown is natural, like in the case of a father who invites his son to jump into the deep end of a pool for the first time. This can be compared to God the Father calling his children to know the transitional process of death. This knowledge of the transitional process can be glorious for some or disastrous for others because all religions preach a process of cause and effect in the interrelationship between the lives of the present and the afterlife. Indicating that souls will be molded and later grouped according to lived experiences.

This teaching neither fanciful nor offensive approaches the future reality in which a spirit we call God watched the Big Bang happen and governs several planets. The opposite seems to be a geocentric tradition out of step with reality and any doctrine contrary to reality will be void because its beliefs do not honor the truth. We are still trying to fathom our solar system and we don't even understand the basic secrets of our galaxy; therefore, how can we understand the Most High who rules the universe and everything beyond? And it is from this lack of understanding that everything is discredited in the spiritual world to come. As technology advances, we will later know the entire transitional process and then there will no longer be faith, but obedience.

Since the science of men has brought us more and more frequent wonders and the next surprise is a brief reality, the understanding of the moments following death is awaited. It can be compared to the birth of Alberto Santos Dumont. If on that day his father had prophesied that in less than a hundred years man would land on the moon, this prophesy would have seemed absurd for a time of metropolises lit by candle lamps and travel by horse and buggy. However, it took place in 1969, 96 years after the birth of the brave Brazilian aviator. The oldest trace of trying to reach the stratosphere is in the Tower of Babel, which happened three hundred generations ago, where men imagined seeing the dwelling of the gods.

In longer retrospect, my great-great-grandfather of a hundred thousand generations ago was naked and hairy, who lived in the savannas of Africa in search of food and shelter when he discovered the first tools of his use; the stone and the stick. Later, other materials such as bone and rope were incorporated into daily use. Putting into motion continuous progress until a distant cousin reached the moon.

This is the greatness of our evolution. We were naked and we went to the moon; therefore, the surprises to come are inconceivable for the humans of today, just as electricity was in the 19th century. And today the fourth generation after the landing on the moon lives an unsettled time by the speed of change, which leads one to think about the succession of events on a surreal scale. If peace prevails, it will be something much greater than the transformation of the world before and after electricity, which made possible the development of equally unimaginable machines. How could we have fathomed the invention of the radio or satellites? So, from now on, technology will catapult our science.

The basis for this surprising transformation comes from the Special Theory of Relativity, developed by Albert Einstein in 1905, as well as from the String Theory, postulated half a century later. These two theories allow us to imagine, respectively, the conversion of matter into energy and the existence of parallel dimensions, which could be related to the heavenly dimensions proclaimed in all religions. The 20th-century discovery of atomic reactions has already proven the conversion of matter into energy and the existence of other dimensions, which is a prerequisite for the equations of the String Theory in finding a mathematical solution. As a person gets older, they realize they have nothing because life passes in a blink of an eye, and have to face death with its lasting, definitive, or nullifying consequences.

For now, we are the chick inside an egg imagining what the outside world is like, when the outside world can insert a selected semen into the egg. We are quite sure that mysteries exist. However, we are not certain if these mysteries will lead us to a new afterlife, because we cannot rule out the possibility of us just being spectators in a great magical ballroom. This is the hypothesis that gives us free will and forgiveness simultaneously. The current reality is that we will all die and we believe that we will move on to another type of life absent from the body that will decompose. This process is unique to all because the origin of life is common to all. We are all given life in a mother's womb and fed by an umbilical cord. The presumption that life continues in stages is in tune with post-relativistic science, which enables all religions to believe in a place of spiritual existence. All religious doctrines are directed towards harmony and human fraternity. They teach that cordiality, solidarity, meditation, and even fasting, will lead to a good reception in the spirit world. After all, every religion is good insofar as they are unifying. But the spiritual world must not be divided like the religions on Earth. It will not be divided by sectors, because there will be someone who is the greatest of all and governs all.

The question then is whether this Almighty being is represented by any of the existing or extinct religions. Many of them prophesied about a protagonist born of a virgin on December 25th, with powers of healing and multiplying food, as well as resurrecting from the dead on the third day. Thus, increasing the difficulty of identifying a true religion that worships an Eternal God, or the Great Programmer, as previously mentioned.

By turning over the merchant tables in the temple, Jesus of Nazareth provoked the right people to be crucified and leave the scene after his resurrection. He did all this so that the apostles could perform miracles in in His absence and in His name. It is exactly because of their submission to His name in spiritual existence that He will be hated and discredited by disregarding His extreme sacrifice. Everything happened according to what was written in scriptures. All the Old Testament prophecies were fulfilled in Him to show the power of a knowledge to come, linked to the Almighty.
